Bad weather has prevented use of the Observatory. Motorization project is still in the design phase. Once this is completed it will be presented to the club for approval.

Outreach:

HCAS members have been getting a lot of "How to" inquiries from new telescope owners. If a member responds to an inquiry please cc the HCAS web site so that other members know not to respond.

New business:

PDF format has been the standard for the newsletter in the past and is preferable to Word format because of compatibility issues and file size when the file contains a lot of graphics. Recommendation was to continue with the PDF format. This will be coordinated between Irv Koplovitz (Sec) and Bill Geertsen (Treas).

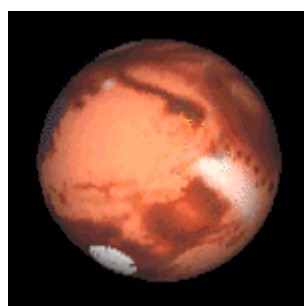
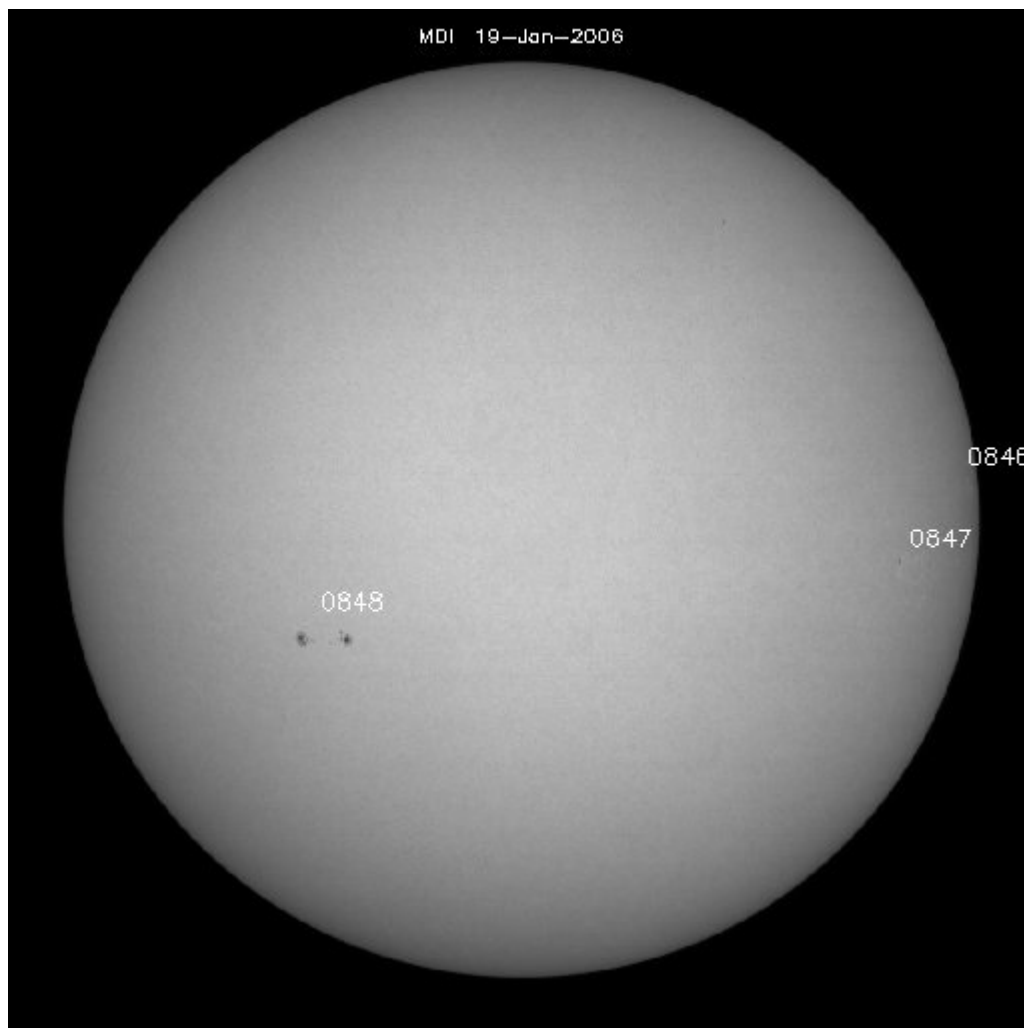
